THE COMMUNITY

Hermon High School, located on U.S. Rt. 2 in Hermon, Maine, serves the students of the town of Hermon (pop. 5,900), as well as tuition students from the SAD #23 - Carmel (pop. 2,656) and Levant (pop. 2,354) and Glenburn (pop. 4,800) school districts. Approximately 48% of the high school's tuition population is from SAD #23, while 4% is from Glenburn. These communities are predominantly rural residential areas, consisting of a broad social and economic spectrum of families. Bangor (pop. 31,008), the largest city in central Maine, is less than ten minutes away and offers a wide variety of educational opportunities, consumer services, health services, and employment opportunities.

THE SCHOOL

Hermon High School is a comprehensive public high school for grades 9 -12. It is accredited by the Maine Department of Education and by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). It is a member of the Penobscot Valley Athletic Conference, Class B. Built in 1995, Hermon High School is one of the most technologically advanced public high schools in the state. All classrooms are equipped with computer terminal services and a telephone with voice mail. Students can access computers through four networked labs. Through Hermon's own fiber optic network, all computers have internet access, email conferencing, and are connected with other schools in the district. Residents of the town of Hermon and student households may also request internet access for no monthly fee.

THE CURRICULUM

The curriculum is college preparatory and includes heterogeneous grouping with the exception of Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, and Honors courses.
